### **Open Forum**

No Police and Communities Together (PACT) meeting because there was no police presence.

Mr Stelfox and Mrs Martin brought to the Council their concerns about recent flooding which had occurred in the Slyne area and the apparent difficulties which they had experienced over communication with the authorities; also their anxiety about the possibility of flooding in the future and the steps which need to be taken to overcome this. They will be making contact with the Authorities concerned.

Heysham/M6 Link; this has now been approved by the Secretary of State; some of the possible implications for the parish were discussed.

County Cllr Jones reported that he would be putting forward applications received from the Scout & Guide Management Committee and from the Over Sixties Club for grants from the County Councillors' allowance scheme.

Mr Ashton explained his design and costings to build a boardwalk across the recreation field from the end of the existing path to the gate in the fence surrounding the play equipment. The boardwalk will be built to meet the requirements of the Disability Discrimination Act. It will also take into account the ground conditions

#### 1063 **Burial Ground**

Cemetery building; slates and ridging tiles have been stripped from part of the roof and stolen; the Police have been informed; measures have been taken to temporarily secure the building and protect it from weather damage.

The building is in poor condition, with woodworm and dry rot; it is now used only for storage of wood and discarded materials; the cost of repair would be uneconomic.

Resolution: to demolish the building and to consider the provision of alternative storage provision.

Checks are to be made with City Council Planning Office regarding regulations for demolition of a building and also what permission will be required to erect a new structure.

Memorial seats; councillors had been supplied with a wide range of bench styles and prices from several manufacturers.

Resolution: to adopt 'Lister' as the supplier and to give a choice of two styles of bench 'Warwick' and 'Evesham'; the fee to be charged will be inclusive of the cost of the bench, the lease of the plot on which the bench stands, the fixing and the maintenance of the bench.

More information is to be obtained before the level of the fee is finally fixed.

An inspection of the burial ground had been made and suggested sites for the benches marked on the burial ground plan.

Provision of a litter bin at the burial ground; whether an extra bin is really needed and also the problem of who would empty it were discussed; decision - not to pursue this further.

Annual inspection and safety checks on memorials -list of graves and notes on inspection criteria had been prepared and were handed out to councillors.

# 1064 Open Spaces

Recreation field path; -see Open Forum above -Mr Ashton has considerable experience in building paths and boardwalks.

<u>Resolution:</u> to award the job to Mr Ashton and ask him to construct a path, in line with the specifications discussed, provided that tests are carried out on the ground and a report produced and minor changes to costings are submitted before the work begins.

Recreation field; consideration of other work which needs to be carried out; councillors were reminded of the schedule for improvements including better disability access. The next step will be the upgrading the entrance near to the telephone exchange on Hanging Green Lane and quotations are to be sought.

Lancashire Best Kept Village Competition; Resolution: to enter the competition again this year and pay the fee of £15. (under \$137)

# 1065 Highways

Canal bridges; Ordnance Survey had been contacted about information included on satnav systems with a suggestion that the alternative routes through the village avoiding the canal bridges should be put into the systems. However it would seem that unless there are warning signs at the bridges this will not be possible. The Lancaster City Council Canal Task Force is looking into the imposition of width restrictions on canal bridges in order to reduce the likelihood of damage.

Concerns caused by recent flooding -see Open Forum above- a recently received document regarding emergency planning was brought to the attention of the meeting -a copy will be circulated to members. The Clerk is to write to the Director of the Emergency Planning team requesting more information in relation to local issues.

Heysham/M6 Link; now that approval has been given, the Parish Council will scrutinise the implementation of the parts of the plan which affect the parish to assess the implications of the developments and the impact on residents and act accordingly to ensure the outcomes are in the best interests of the parish and its residents.
